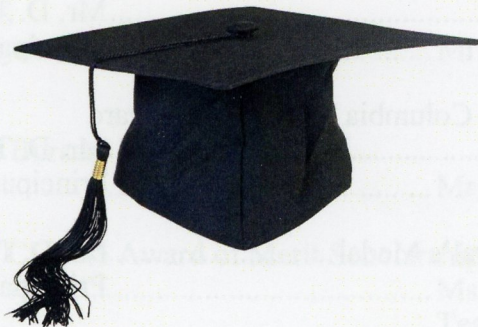

Awards Presented by Speakers

Parliamentary Award

The recipient of this award is a good citizen and volunteer.

Jordan Thomas Scholarship

The Jordan Thomas Scholarship was established in honour of former St. John's High School student and Tigers Football player, Jordan Thomas. Jordan had a short but impactful life, and is mourned and missed by his family and friends. The recipient should reflect the characteristics of Jordan Thomas and will be an indigenous student who is giving back to the St. John's High School and/or the greater community, is involved in sports, is helpful and caring, and/or is a good ambassador of our neighbourhood and school.

Mynarski Ward Citizenship Scholarship

The Mynarski Ward Citizenship Scholarship is awarded to a student with good grades, a positive attitude, is continuing to post-secondary education and participates both inside and outside of school.

Indigenous Youth Leadership Program Award

The recipient of this award has received a Cultural Studies credit. They are inspirational, motivated, and demonstrate commitment to the values of the Seven Teachings.

Souchay Gossen Foundation Scholarship for CEDA Recipients

The Souchay Gossen Family Foundation CEDA Scholarship goes to students who have shown commitment to education through consistent attendance and high academic standing. They are an attendee of the CEDA afterschool programs.

Winnipeg Teacher's Association School Scholarship

The Winnipeg Teacher's Association awards one graduating student at each Winnipeg School Division high school a scholarship to put towards pursuing post secondary education. The student must be register as a full-time student at a qualifying post secondary institution the year following graduation, and must display outstanding citizenship.

Winnipeg School Board Post Secondary Scholarships

These awards were established in 1972 to replace the Isbister Scholarships. Each high school in the Winnipeg School Division is granted one scholarship of \$1000 to a senior student, who must use it to further their studies in a post-secondary institution.

Walter and Maria Schroeder Foundation Scholarships

Established in 2018, the Walter and Maria Foundation offers up to eight full tuition scholarships each year to St. John's High School accepted into full time post-secondary studies at the University of Manitoba. Students must demonstrate academic excellence, integrity, community engagement, and financial need. Accepted students must intend to study one of the following University of Manitoba faculties: Computer Science, Business, or Engineering. Selected applicants who identify as Indigenous may choose to study in a different faculty at the University of Manitoba.

University of British Columbia Presidential Award

The Presidential Scholars Award program offers the most prestigious awards available to students who are entering UBC. These include a one-time award of approximately \$5,000, and renewable awards of up to \$40,000 on the Okanagan campus, and \$80,000 on the Vancouver campus, each payable over four years. High school and CEGEP students who are Canadian citizens and permanent residents are eligible for the Presidential Scholars Award. These awards recognize students who excel across the board and who have demonstrated academic and leadership achievements in the arts, community, athletics, and school.

The Governor General's Medal

Established in 1873, the Governor General Medal is the most prestigious award that students in Canadian Schools can achieve. They are awarded to the graduating student with the highest average in their high school.

List of Awards

Allan Flam and Freda Perman Fund

The Allan Flam and Freda Perman fund will be awarded annually to a graduating student from St. John's High School who identifies as Indigenous, is an active part of the CEDA, WASAC, or IYLP programs, and is pursuing post-secondary education.

Alumni Association Special Presentation

An Alumni pin is presented to each St. John's High School graduate.

Anne Ross Scholarship

Anne Ross came to Canada at the age of 11 to escape persecution. She was faced with adjusting to a new culture and learning a new language. After graduating from St. John's, she went on to become a Registered Nurse. She retired after a long career at Mount Carmel Clinic, where, under her leadership, Mount Carmel became the first community health clinic in Canada. She was passionate about the North End and worked hard to develop programs that met the needs of the community in which she lived. She was later recognized for her work by being awarded the Order of Canada for her work there. This scholarship is given to a student who has successfully faced the challenges of a new country and language and is planning to continue their education after graduation.

Aron Katz Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship honours the memory of Aron Katz, class of 1969, who gave his life while saving his younger sister from drowning in the Whiteshell. In 2019, Aron's classmates decided to honour him by establishing this annual scholarship. It recognises a graduating student each year who demonstrates academic promise, exhibits empathy for others, and has shown courage in the face of adversity.

Betty Clark Bursary

This award is given to a graduating St. John's student of Metis descent who is going on to further their studies. It was established by Keith Ginther and his wife, both graduates of St. John's. Keith was greatly impacted by the work of attendance officer Betty Clark, and wanted to give back to the school.

Brian Burdy Award of Excellence in Science

This award originated in 2014 to honour the contributions Brian Burdy made to the growth and development of science education at St. John's, as well as his related involvement provincially, nationally, and internationally. He was alumni, class of 1965, and a St. John's teacher from 1969-1983, including many years as the science department head. The award recognizes a grade 12 students with the highest average in any two of the three science courses.

Canadian Polish Athletic Club Award

The Canadian Polish Athletic Club began 67 years ago as a way for a group of former North End young adults to give back to the community. Since 1964, CPAC has provided annual "continuing education awards" to the students of St. John's High School for a student who exhibits proficiency in academics, citizenship and sports.

Captain Curtis Cyr Memorial Bursary

This award is named after Curtis Cyr who spent 32 years serving the City of Winnipeg as a Firefighter, eventually attaining the rank of Captain. Curtis never gave up on his dream to become a firefighter and had to overcome many obstacles to get onto the Winnipeg Fire Department in 1989. In his spare time, Curtis pursued his passion for woodworking and carpentry. It is the families hope that this award will help someone who has a passion for the trades on their journey to achieving their dreams.

CEDA Bursaries and Pathway Bursary

Pathways to Education's innovative, community-based Program locations help communities across Canada reach their full potential through academic achievement, high school graduation, and post-secondary opportunities. Pathways to Education partners with well-established local organizations who deliver programming directly to students in the community using its proven combination of academic, financial, social, and one-on-one supports. In Winnipeg, Pathways to Education partners with the Community Education Development Association (CEDA). CEDA Pathways to Education provides students in the Lord Selkirk Park, William Whyte, Dufferin, and North Point Douglas neighbourhoods with dynamic and progressive programming that reflects our community's current needs. Graduating students from the CEDA: Pathways to Education program are awarded financial bursaries to assist with the costs of post-secondary education

Child Guidance Clinical Award Merit Scholarship

This award was established in 2011 in commemoration of 60 years of dedicated service to children, families, and the community. Awards of Merit are presented to graduating high school students in The Winnipeg School Division who have shown resilience and determination in the face of adversity.

Chown Centennial Scholarships

An entrance scholarship offered by the University of Manitoba. Each high school in Manitoba and Northwestern Ontario receives one. It is provided by income from a gift in memory of Charles Gray Chown. To qualify for this award, a student must complete high school with high academic standing, and be registered for a full-time course load in a direct entry program at the University of Manitoba.

Don Constantini Award for Excellence in Practical Arts

Don Constantini was a long-time teacher at St. John's High School. This award goes to a student with high standing marks in Practical Arts. The recipient is a grade 12 student with high standing marks in Practical Arts.

Eugene Kostyra Memorial Award

The recipient(s) are pursuing their post-secondary education at a College, University or in the Trades. The recipient has demonstrated a commitment to social justice and/or human rights. At least one of the students comes from an underrepresented or marginalized group (including but not limited to underrepresented racial populations, women, LGBTQI, Individuals with disabilities, etc.)

Evan Tynes Inspiration Award

The Evan Tynes memorial award is given to a student who shows inspiration and aspires to future endeavours. The student, who will receive this award, has shown a love for education and learning.

Evan Tynes Spirit Award

The Evan Tynes Spirit award is given to a student who shows Spirit and aspires to future endeavours. The student, who will receive this award, has shown a love for education and learning.

FireSpirit: Aboriginal Youth Internship Program (AYIP)

Manitoba Children and Youth Opportunities partners with FireSpirit Inc. to deliver an Aboriginal Youth Internship Program (AYIP) to Winnipeg/Capital region Indigenous high school students. The FireSpirit bursary is presented to all graduating students who have completed the FireSpirit program in recognition of their accomplishments in high school.

Francis Brown Atwell Award for the Arts

This award was donated by Francis Brown Atwell's husband, the late George Ivan Henry Atwell, and family in the hopes that her musical talent and caring ways would be sustained in her community school. It is to be awarded to a St. John's High School student who exemplifies a sense of community spirit and best demonstrates exceptional promise in the Arts.

Friends of Winnipeg Youth Awards Fund

In 2017 the Winnipeg Foundation created this scholarship program by consolidating the CanWest Peter M Liba Memorial Bursary Fund and the Ilene Meder Fund, with a gift from the Winnipeg Regional Health Authority. These awards are meant to encourage the pursuit of post-secondary education for promising young people. The recipient is based on hard work, engagement in and commitment to learning, and active participation in their community.

George Bates Award for Most Resilient Student

George Bates taught at SJHS for 23 years . He was a Metis educator who overcame many obstacles in his lifetime and could have given up on his education. He persevered throughout the years to complete his education and become a teacher. This award honours a student who has faced barriers and has continued to persevere despite the challenges they have faced.

Grandma Support Group Scholarship

The St. John's Grandma Support Group was started in 2006 by then Vice Principal Christine Penner, in order to support Grandmas who were caring for their grandkids. In 2016 the Grandmas decided to start a scholarship for a student who has lived with and been raised by a grandma and is furthering their education. The scholarship was originally funded through bake and craft sales at school events. Since 2020, it has been funded by a donation from the sister group Grannies Gone Global, following Christine's passing.

Harry Dmytryshyn Memorial Scholarship for Mathematics

The Harry Dmytryshyn Memorial Scholarship for Mathematics honours the Grade 12 student who has achieved the top average mark in Applied Mathematics at the Grade 12 level. This reward comes with the recipient's name on the Harry Dmytryshyn Memorial Scholarship for Mathematics.

Harry Finkle Bursary and Scholarship

The family of Harry Finkle has established a fund of \$20,000 to provide annual bursaries and scholarships to students from St. John's High School and Sisler High who will be continuing their education at the University of Manitoba. The annual income from this fund is matched dollar for dollar by the Eric Hildebrand and Ann Palmer Hildebrand Memorial Scholarship Fund

- * **Harry Finkle North End Bursary and Scholarship:** This scholarship is awarded to a student who is Indigenous, first-generation Canadian, or landed immigrant who has persevered and achieved a high academic standing in their graduation courses.
- * **Mary and Louis Finkle Bursary and Scholarship:** This scholarship is awarded to a student who is Indigenous, first-generation Canadian, or landed immigrant who has persevered and achieved a high academic standing in their graduation courses.
- * **Sonia and Ralph Kaplan Bursary and Scholarship:** The Sonia & Ralph Kaplan Aboriginal and Immigrant Scholarship is awarded to a student who is Indigenous, first-generation Canadian, or landed immigrant, achieved an 80% or higher overall average and is enrolled at the University of Manitoba.

HH Herstein Award

The H.H. Herstein award is presented to a student with High academic Standing in Gr 11 History with continued demonstration in Indigenous Advocacy.

John Loxley Pollock's Hardware Co-Op Award

The John Loxley-Pollock's Hardware Co-op Scholarship was started in 2013 and is awarded every year to an Indigenous student graduating from St.

John's High School, looking to pursue post-secondary education. The award was started in honour of John Loxley, who sadly passed away in 2020. John was a professor of Economics at the University of Manitoba and spent much of his career focusing on community economic development. John was an active community member who brought people together around exciting projects in the North End. In 2008 John helped co-found Pollock's Hardware as a cooperative and was the first Chair of the Board, serving for 10 years. Pollock's has been a staple in the North End of Winnipeg since 1922, and when the previous owners wanted to retire, the community purchased the business and started a cooperative in its place. Pollock's Hardware Co-op now has over 4000 members and is more than just a hardware store. Pollock's provides services for the neighbourhood, hosts events and hires people from the community, including students and alumni of St. John's High School. The Cooperative actively works to support Indigenous businesses and organizations, especially those in the North End. We would encourage students, family members and graduation attendees to visit and support the store and become a member of the Cooperative. John looked forward to giving out this award each year. He believed that financial means should not be a barrier to education and worked hard to support students any way he could. He would be so pleased to see this award go to such a deserving recipient this year. On behalf of his family and the entire Pollock's Board and membership, congratulations to this year's winner.

Marie Zorniak Memorial Award for Personal Achievement

This award has been established to honour Marie Zorniak, a well-loved and missed institution of St. John's. She truly embodied Tiger Pride. This award is presented to a graduate of the FOCUS program who has overcome obstacles in the pursuit of higher learning.

Monty Hall Scholarship

Dr. Monty Hall, O.C., O.M., a 1946 alumnus of the University of Manitoba, Faculty of Science established the Monty Hall Scholarships as a part of his many philanthropic works. His dedication to helping others has earned Dr. Hall numerous honors and awards including the Order of Manitoba in 2002, Officer of the Order of Canada in 1987 and a Variety Clubs International Humanitarian Award in 1983. Each year a scholarship is offered to a student graduating from St. John's High School with high standing, and is registered in a full course load at University of Manitoba for the fall.

Murray Leslie Firman and Joan Firman Scholarship

Each year a scholarship is given to the most deserving high school student in the Industrial Arts Electronics Course in the name of Joan Julia and Murray Leslie Firman.

Oleh Klymkiw Inclusion Support Award and Bursary

This award was named for a teacher at St. John's who was dedicated to enriching the lives of students at the school who lived with an intellectual or physical disability. The Class of '77 recognized that the majority of awards use criteria based on high academics or athletics, and were of the view that students who had intellectual or physical challenges, though not meeting those criteria, were just as deserving based on their contribution to the school. The award goes to a student in the special needs program who demonstrated their love for the school through their contributions in whatever form it took.

Parent and Community Advisory Council Recognition Award

The recipient is a graduating student who is pursuing some form of post-secondary institution who has worked both inside and outside the school to make the community a better place.

Platinum Jets "North End Pride" Scholarship

This award is presented to a "good" student who has worked hard and applied themselves to their studies. The award celebrates the student as a productive and contributing member within school and community. The recipient should be a person who does not have the highest marks nor star athlete, therefore will not receive other awards.

Randy Engstrom Memorial Award

Randy Engstrom was a much-loved teacher at St. John's High School. Randy passed away in 2004 and a scholarship was created in his memory. He appreciated a student who aspired to overcome challenges, to NEVER give up, to move into the work force.

Safiniuk Athletic Scholarship

The Safiniuk Athletic Scholarship is presented to a student-athlete who contributes to the athletic community at St. John's High School. The recipient has plans for post-secondary education, is in financial need and is a good-hearted individual.

Shirley Anne Teplitsky-Marantz Award

Awarded to the graduating student with the highest mark in a grade 12 English course.

Social Sciences Award of Excellence

Awarded to the graduating student with the highest mark in 2 Social Sciences Courses

Souchay Gossen Foundation Award

The Souchay Gossen Family Foundation Scholarship is awarded to a student who has shown commitment to education through consistent attendance and high academic standing

Souchay Gossen Foundation Award – Welcome Hand Award

This award recipient will be a landed immigrant or a first-generation Canadian, and is based on an application process.

Tallman Scholarship

The Tallman Foundation was founded in 2006 by Princess Auto president and chairman of the board Bob Tallman, his wife Cathy, and his father Harvey, who in 1942, sold his truck to buy Princess Auto Wrecking on Princess Street. The Tallman Foundation provides full scholarships to post-secondary students in Winnipeg and two other foundations, the Princess Auto Foundation and the Play Through Foundation, support education and quality of living initiatives for students and children in Winnipeg's inner city. The mandate of the Princess Auto Foundation is to provide financial assistance to fulltime students enrolled in pre-employment skilled trades and technology programs at Canadian Colleges. Recipients have unmet financial need and have demonstrated academic skills that will give them a high probability of successfully completing their program.

Theresa Barbara Konyk Memorial Scholarship

The Theresa Barbara Konyk Memorial award is awarded to a student with good academic standing and who will be pursuing post-secondary education, and who comes from a single parent home.

University of Manitoba Entrance Scholarships

The U of M offers entrance scholarships in different amounts based on student's final average in qualifying grade 12 courses.

University of Winnipeg Entrance Scholarships

The U of W offers entrance scholarships in different amounts based on student's final average in qualifying grade 12 courses.

William and Jean Meagher Bursary Trust Fund

This fund was established in 1987 through a gift from William and Jean Meagher to provide bursaries covering up to four years of post secondary education for students attending Inner-city high schools. The recipient is a student who wishes to continue their education and has achieved reasonable academic standing while contributing in a meaningful way to student life at their school.

William and Mary Scharfe Memorial Bursary

The William and Mary Scarfe Memorial Bursary is presented each year to a student who will be pursuing their post-secondary education in a medical program or research field.

Winnipeg School Division Building from Within Scholarship

The Build from Within program was developed by the Winnipeg School Division in order to increase the number of Indigenous teachers on their staff. Recipients will join a cohort that will complete a Bachelor of Arts and a Bachelor of Education through the University of Winnipeg, supported by a full scholarship and mentoring.

Winnipeg School Division Medical Careers Exploration Program

Students who have completed the Medical Careers Exploration Program will be presented with an award and stethoscope.
